Welcome: Travis -Turn the time over to Principal for data

Brad - Went over several Data sheets attached:

Wellness Center Data:

Trimester 1: 367 visits = emotional 168, physical 139, relationships 36 School issues 24. Number of different students using the center, 125.

Trimester 2: 144 visits = emotional 112, physical 32. Number of different students using the center 68.

- Student visits to the office are significantly lower since we have opened the wellness center.
- Students stays at wellness center are 10 minutes. They learn skills to self regulate, calm down, then are sent back to class.

Licensed Clinical Social Worker Group Data :

42 students signed up for groups, 1 hr. week. (Parent permission required)

- Top 4 issues - Anxiety, Depression, Friendship, Social Issues.
- Anger (only 2), Grief and loss.
- Data on one, oppositional defiant student use to be sent to the office 3 or more times a week/day. Now can go two or three weeks before being sent to the office.
- This is being paid for out of the TSSA grant money that we will have indefinitely from the Utah State Legislature.

Call home log:

- 218 kids called home with headaches, sick etc., 17 emotional needs, 56 relationship issues, 162 needed parents to bring something (assignments etc).

All these things reduce the time students spend in the counseling office. Now counselors are able to spend more time with the CCR program, and being guidance counselors, which is really what their job is.

English Learners Data:

if a school is 40 MPG or higher on the scale of testing, they are doing OK.

- Science, we scored 52! With 5.4 percent of students proficient. Last year we had Zero.
- Language Arts, we scored 47.
- Math, 40. Math is harder among schools across the board, 7th grade shows better than 6th grade. 6th grade math is always introducing brand new concepts, they get developmentally better and do better in 7th grade.

Honor Roll. Jag Tags comparison sheet.

- 52% of our students are on the honor roll. Those are students who got 3.5 GPA and above. Students can receive an academic excellence award, if the teacher recommends them. These can be students that are on the honor roll, or students that don't have the 3.5 or higher that are really trying and giving their very best effort and showing growth.

The data shows, as a school, we are moving in the right direction! :)

Safety issues:

- Resource officer has handed out about 50 blinking reflector light buttons that students can wear when biking, skating to school etc...
- Biking safety issues with kids crossing through the parking lot instead of using the sidewalks.
- We have signed up for Bike Utah – We will get going before the school year ends.

- Parking lot safety- District has given approval for us to move the bike rack, and add speed bumps.
- Suggestions were made to make the parking lot a one way only, entrance and exit. Paint crosswalk striping across the entrances and exits. Designate a right turn lane, and a left turn lane on exit opening.
- We will train the students to walk their bike across, but understand that even with training, kids this age are not very observant, nor realize the danger they put themselves in.

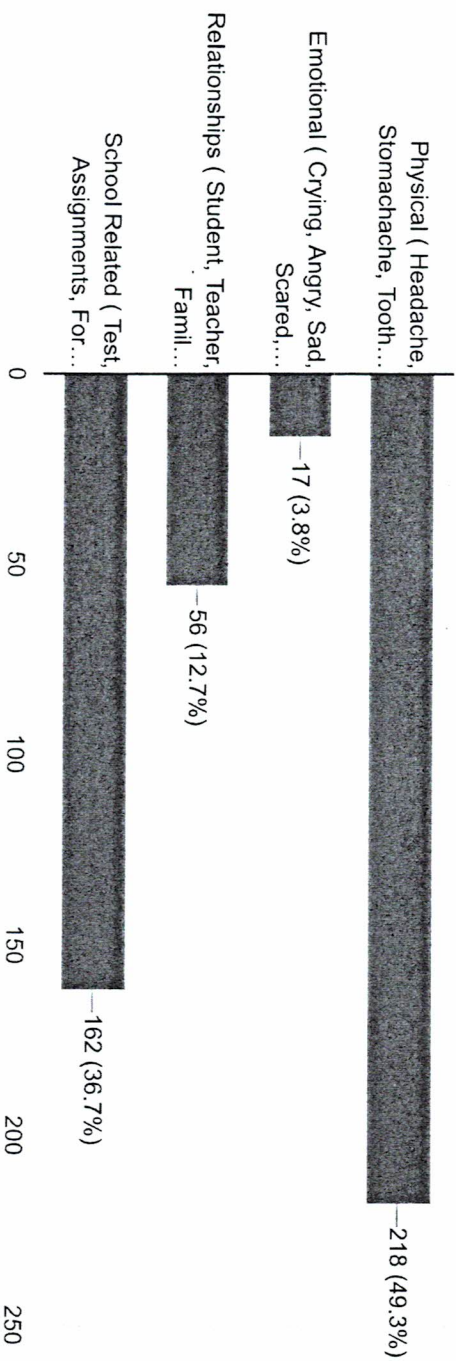

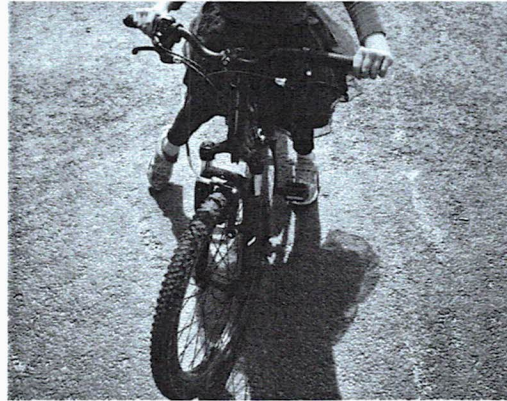

BEST PROGRAM

The Youth Bicycle Education and Safety Training (BEST) Program teaches more than 3,000 Utah kids every year how to safely and confidently experience their communities by bicycle. The Program is a 5-hour, in-class and on-bike program taught at schools around Utah, targeting students in the 4th to 7th grades. Bike Utah provides trained instructors, bicycles, helmets, and all other equipment for the duration of the program at no cost.



Students learn:

- The benefits of riding a bicycle
- Rules of the road
- Helmet fitting
- Bicycle safety checks
- Navigating intersections
- Right of way
- Avoiding hazards

The program can be administered at schools in all corners of Utah, and, with your help, the goal is to reach students in each Utah county!
