Happy Holidays from the Counseling Center

This month our school will be participating in the KONY Coins for Kids PENNY WARS CHALLENGE (December 7th—11th) to help raise money for families that are disadvantaged. How it works... Courtney Crane—Food Service Worker


Staff Spotlight

Just a quick reminder that your child is assigned to ride a bus to and from school. Unfortunately, we cannot allow students to switch buses and ride to other places. 
