Dear Parents, Guardians and HIS Students,

February is a fun month for our counseling departments here at HIS! Our incoming 6th graders, the current 5th graders in the five different elementary schools that come here, will be visiting our school in a 5th Grade Orientation event on Feb 9th and 10th. It is always really fun for our music students to perform for them and our student leaders to show them around the school to explain how school works.

Our current 6th graders will be registering for 7th grade on Feb 11th and 12th, in the computer lab. They will select next year's elective, and an alternative, print it, and take it home for parent signature. We have some outstanding music, art, and theater classes to choose from. Some students may select Office, Media, or Teacher's Aide as an elective, as well, but they are very competitive.

NetSmartz will be coming to our school and talking about Internet Safety in an assembly on Feb. 25th. We have found that it is increasingly important for students to be more careful while on-line, and to know how to protect themselves, and what to do if they are having problems. This group of presenters are fun and knowledgeable and hopefully the student will be safer because of it. Parents are always welcome at our assemblies.

The last day of February, and into the first week of March, is the biggest event of our counseling program. It is RASK week. RASK stands for Random Acts of Service & Kindness. Our Peer Mediators help with the logistics of this week, where we will be having a poster contest, with a Rip Stick, gift cards, and other prizes being awarded to the students that win in one of five categories: Best Use of Color, Most Detail, Most Creative, Best Use of Theme, and Student Choice. The Best of Show will win a Rip Stick, and the other categories will receive various gift cards from our local businesses.

The Peer Mediators are currently preparing a video that explains the contest and gives examples of acts of service and kindness. We will also distribute cards to all students where they will be asked to do an act of service/kindness each day of the week, have an adult here at school initial it, and then their card will be put in a RASK pot fro a drawing on Friday.

The Peer Mediators will also read a quote at the beginning of Homeroom about service and kindness. We will also have a Smile Wall, where students can write on a sticky note an act of kindness they saw someone do. The RASK week is our favorite week of the year because it focuses on the rewards of doing for others and promotes feelings of caring about others. The posters show the many different ways of being kind and are inspiring to see. We invite parents to come and visit our school to see the posters and Smile Wall that week. Character ED Theme of the Month is:

#### Habit 5—Seek First to Understand, Then to be Understood

In school we're taught how to read, write, and speak. However, listening is one of the most important communication skills of all. Listening with our ears isn't good enough, because less than 10% of communications is contained in the words we use. The rest comes from body language and the tone and feeling reflected in our voice.

Steps to become 100% listeners (words, body language and tone)

- 1. Try to go one hour without talking. Instead, just watch the people around you and listen o what they are saying. Good luck!
- 2. Think of someone in your life that is a good listener. What do they do that makes them a good listener?
- 3. The next time someone around you is sad notice their eyes, or their body language. Tell them you notice they are sad and you want to help.
