Rainey: Welcome.... Todd Hohbein, Staci Glazier, & Mike Butler couldn't make it today.

Recapped the ROAR Incentive program. We have a scanner that tracks student incentives with what teachers are handing them out and participating.... We are starting to get good data on if the program is working to motivate struggling students, or if it is just rewarding the good students for being good....

We now have also incorporated **Incident cards** - tracked in three degrees of offense... Green level 1, Yellow level 2, Red level 3. We can see which students are causing trouble and can also see if they are causing trouble for just one or two teachers or if their problem persists all day.

School Plan for next year: School District has hired a new secretary to manage Trustland money. She will be much better at communicating figures to community council members.

- Brad met with her and discussed needs. Paraprofessional help we will need for next year. \$1,200.00 to add a ½ hour aid that will help kids when they arrive and when they leave.... Making sure get off on the right foot.
- One aid (Belen) would be paid 12.2 hours a week so she will help ESL and SPED kids.
- One aid (Tanner) would accompany kids to mainstream classes.
- There are already good things happening in classes, even for high learners, so we feel
 we need the para support for the kids who are struggling learners.
- Chromebooks still need to be rotated, 4 sets needed for next year as some are outdated and students can't test on them....
- We should have \$13,000 carryover from this year so the Projected amount for next year will be about \$85,000.00.
- We don't know what will happen with registration next year as far as enrollment with the charter school students. We usually have about 30-40 kids that come from the charter school and the district doesn't fund those students for us until October....and that is a whole class worth.....
- We would like for Nichelle Richins to continue Co-teaching a class with Mrs. Baker where ½ students have an IEP, and ½ don't. It has been a good mix.. It pushes the IEP kids in language arts. Both these part time teachers have husbands that already have insurance so they are the cheapest teachers to use Trustland money for.

Rainey asked about \$ for extra counselor......We have been approved for a counselor for 3 days a week next year so that will really help. We may open it up and use some Trustland money for an LCWS-clinical guidance counselor to work with kids. We have one that comes only once a week now. This may be paid for by grant money...... They could set up some Anger management groups, grief groups,... etc... we have many students with troubled homes.

We may be able to share the LCWS with our conesite so they will have a few less schools to manage and can spend more time here..... We will also have a full time resource officer who will help with some of those problematic things.

Safety concerns, teachers will wear badges full time, we funnel kids through one unlocked door, the rest of the doors are locked. Funnel parents and all visitors, into the office with stanchions...

Thanks for serving with us this year. Parent support and input are KEY as you bring a different perspective of our students....
