Dear Jaguar Families,

As we enter March, we are excited to share some valuable resources and insights from the most recent February Parent Education Night that HIS hosted. Thanks to Cary Mac Arther LMFT, who presented on the topic "Helping Your Child Feel Safe in Anxiety: The ANCHOR Approach," as parents it can be helpful to have strategies to support our children as they navigate anxiety.

Cary's presentation focused on how we, as parents and caregivers, can help our children manage and cope with anxiety in a way that builds resilience and emotional security. Below, we've summarized the ANCHOR approach, a simple but powerful framework:

The ANCHOR Approach:

- Acknowledge their feelings without minimizing.
 "You're feeling really nervous about this. I get it."
 Recognize and validate your child's emotions without brushing them off.
- Normalize that anxiety is a part of life.
 "It's okay to feel this way. Worry is our brain's way of keeping us safe." Let your child know that anxiety is a normal response to stress.
- 3. Connect with calm presence. Your calmness helps them stay calm. Take deep breaths, stay present, and offer steady reassurance.
- 4. Hold space instead of fixing. Resist the urge to solve the problem immediately. Instead, reassure your child that they can handle the discomfort, even if it's hard.
- 5. Offer a grounding tool. Introduce sensory techniques like holding something cold, taking deep belly breaths, or naming five things in the room.
- Reinforce resilience.
 "Remember last time you were nervous about your soccer game? And then you ended up enjoying it? You can do hard things."
 Remind your child of past challenges they've overcome to boost their confidence.

Mt. Readmore Stand Alone Book Club







Please Read!



All upcoming 7th grade students need the following additional immunizations BEFORE the start of the school year:

1 Meningococcal

- 1 Tdap booster (Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis)
- 2 Hepatitis A and 3 Hepatitis B Immunizations
- 2 Varicella (Chicken Pox) Immunization (or proof of having had the disease by signing the official card.

If your student has received these immunizations, please provide a copy of the immunization record to the school before school starts. If you have previously submitted an exemption form, please note that Section 53G-9-303 of the Utah Statutory Code requires these exemptions to be renewed before 7th grade entry. This needs to be done on a computer not a mobile phone as the Certificate does not download correctly. You will need to send in a copy of the New Exemption Certificate. Remember that all of the Vaccine boxes need to be checked off. Please check that before printing it. For any questions, feel free to email me @cheree.crosby@washk12.org.
