Dear Parents, Guardians and Hurricane Intermediate Students:

Welcome to Hurricane Intermediate and the 2026-2027 school year! If you're looking for the absolute best place for students to learn, grow, and have an amazing time doing it—you've found it. Our dedicated staff has put together an incredible lineup of learning experiences for this year. We love our community and can't wait to partner with you and your student to make this our most exciting school year ever!

The following information is being provided to assist you and your student in preparation for the upcoming year:

- ✓ We encourage you to get **IMMUNIZATIONS** as soon as possible. Students will not be permitted to attend school without proof of up-to-date immunization records. If there are questions as to your student's status regarding immunizations, feel free to call the Main Office at Hurricane Intermediate...we would love to help you! **State requirements for immunizations prior to entering the 7th grade are:**
 - **1 Tetanus/Diphtheria booster**
 - **1 Meningococcal**
 - **2 Hepatitis A and 3 Hepatitis B immunizations**
 - **2 Varicella (Chicken pox) immunization** (or proof of having had the disease by signing the official card)

The **FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL** will be **Thursday, August 13**. **ONLINE REGISTRATION and PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES** through [parent PowerSchool account](#) will be available beginning on the afternoon of **AUGUST 5th**. [PLEASE PAY FOR YOUR SCHOOL FEES ONLINE](#). Once **ALL school fees are paid**, students will be able to **access and print** their class schedule on **PowerSchool starting the afternoon of August 5th**. PE Uniforms can be paid online through Powerschool and **PICKED UP** at Back to School Night in the Gym. **PLEASE PAY FOR THESE ONLINE** prior to Back to School Night. Please note that **all** card transactions will be assessed a 3.59 % transaction fee per district policy.

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION will begin on **August 3rd-7th FROM 8AM-11AM and 12:30PM-2:30PM, by appointment only**. Please [click this link](#) for Registration Information. During **NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION** our Counselors and Secretaries will be available to help register, collect immunization paperwork, take fee payments, and create class schedules for any students new to the Washington County School District. **NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION** will also provide the opportunity for students and parents to become acquainted with the building in preparation for the new school year. [Please contact](#) our school registrar to make an appointment for your **NEW** student registration.

- ✓ **BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT** will be **Tuesday, August 11th at 3:30-5:00PM** at Hurricane Intermediate. Starting at 3:30PM, a food truck will be available in the parking lot. Students that come to Back to School Night will receive a ticket for free treats at the food truck...*we have a limited amount of free tickets, so get here on time!* We will also be handing a limited amount of free t-shirts to students this evening. Our Back to School Night is an open house format. Please feel free to walk the school and meet all of your new teachers. **The front office and counseling will not be open during this time, but our Finance window will be open if you need to make payments for your school fees.** Please make sure to pay all of your fees online **PRIOR** to Back to School Night. This will alleviate long lines.

- ✓ The **FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL** (August 13th) is exciting for everybody! School will **START at 7:45am**. In order to help your student on the first day, have them prepared with the following:
 - Backpack, Pencils, Paper, notebook. (see teacher websites for any additional supplies needed)
 - A lunch from home or lunch money (if it hasn't been prepaid)
 - The student's printed class schedule
 - A positive attitude and willingness to learn

- ✓ Since many of you will be purchasing clothes for your student prior to school, please be aware of the following guidelines regarding the **WCSD DRESS CODE**:
 - Clothing and grooming of all students should be neat, clean and safe
 - Any apparel displaying profanity, suggestive slogans, pictures or graphics, or promoting substances illegal for consumption by a minor, will not be allowed
 - Chest, midriff and buttocks must be covered at all times.

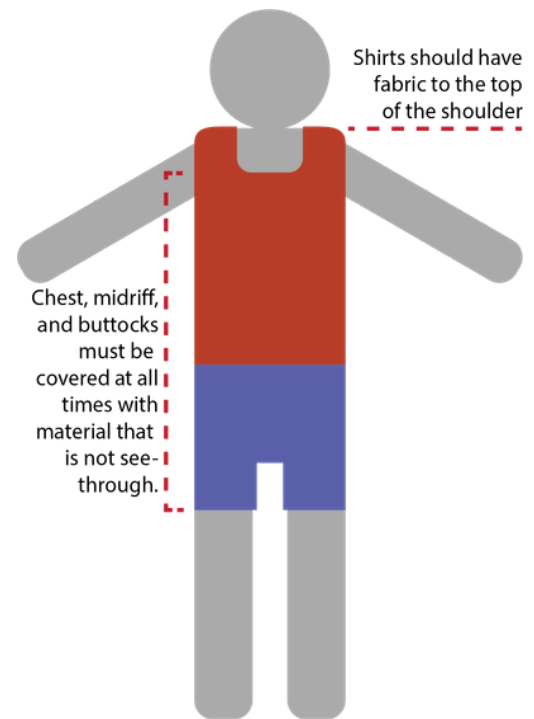
WCSD Student Dress Guidelines

School administrators are responsible for the implementation and enforcement of student conduct, dress and appearance standards contained in District policy 2200 Student Dress Code and these guidelines. The legal concept of “reasonableness” shall be the guiding principle in the application and discipline of student conduct, dress and appearance. Adherence to the conduct, dress, and appearance standards and these guidelines will be the responsibility of the student and their parent(s)/guardian(s). School administrators will have final judgment on all matters concerning interpretation of student conduct, dress, and appearance.

The following specific guidelines have been established to aid students, parents, staff and administration in the implementation and enforcement of policy 2200 Student Dress Code.

Dress and Appearance Standards include (but are not limited to) the following:

1. Clothing should be clean and in good repair.
2. Hats and other headwear:
 - a. May be worn unless it disrupts the school or school activity, poses a danger to self or others, or limits the ability of others to identify the student.
 - b. Any headwear that does not allow the student's face to be visible is not allowed.
3. Clothing (See figure):
 - a. Must be appropriate in length and not revealing.
 - b. Must provide coverage of the torso with no viewable undergarments. Coverage will be with material that is not see-through
 - c. Tank tops and tube tops are not permitted
4. Clothing, appearance, jewelry, accessory, footwear, or personal item shall be free of any writing, images, symbols, or any other insignias that:
 - a. Are lewd, vulgar, profane, obscene, or sexually suggestive.
 - b. Advocates, represents, or promotes racism, discrimination, violence or hate in any form.
 - c. Signifies or depicts gangs and/or illegal or criminal activities. (Administrators in consultation with law enforcement agencies will determine what signifies and/or depicts these activities.)
 - d. Shows or references tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or any illegal substance.
5. Footwear, appropriate for the day's activities, shall be worn at all times.
6. Any dress or appearance item or practice that creates an unhealthy, unsafe, or disruption to the school or school activity may be prohibited.



With the approval of District administration and the School Community Council, schools may make minor changes and/or adaptations to the dress and appearance standards in order to address local needs. Schools should seek input from various stakeholder groups.

HIS Policy: Electronic Devices (Phones, iPods, etc.)

Students are allowed to use electronic devices (phones, iPods, AirPods, game devices, etc.) **before school begins** each morning until the bell rings to send students to class. Once that occurs, **students are expected to power off their devices and place them in their backpacks** where they will remain until the end of the day—this includes listening devices as well.



Students who ignore this policy may be asked to hand over their device to a faculty member where it may be taken to the main office. In those instances, parents will be contacted so that they can come to the school at their earliest convenience to pick up the device.
